The overall objective is to contribute to the goals of the country's commitment to "Mitigate the Consequences of Mine Action and ERW Accidents. The specific objective is to enhance immediate and pastoral care support to mine and explosive remnants of war (ERW) victims and to improve access to medical support, assessment, and rehabilitation of victims in Badakhshan Province of Afghanistan. FSD has been working in this region of North East Afghanistan now for over 15 years as a specialist mine action agency and has cleared over two square kilometers of contaminated land. In parallel, much data has been collected on victims in the region; some small operations have started to identify how best to support these victims through medical support and livelihood initiates and education/awareness activities for local fmailes and community memebers. This will increase knowledge of the scope of suport needed in the region for government agencies; increase access for victims to medical support and livelihood/economic opportunities for victims. Sustainability is incorporated in this project by training and using local community focal points/staff to conduct the work alongside direct mentoring and training of key coordinators in each region. This project will also provide direct and lasting income opportunities for victims allowing them more sustainable freedom and autonomy.
